Subject: Representation Regarding Stray Dog Management, Resident Safety and Hygiene within the Society Premises

Dear Sir/~~Madam~~,

We, the undersigned residents of Kendriya Vihar Phase II, respectfully draw your immediate attention to the growing concerns regarding the presence of **three stray dogs** roaming freely within our residential blocks. While we recognize and support the humane treatment of animals, we are equally concerned about the safety, hygiene and peaceful enjoyment of the common areas by all residents.

We understand that, in accordance with the judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, stray dogs cannot be arbitrarily removed or relocated if they coexist peacefully and do not cause any inconvenience to residents. The Hon'ble Court has also recognized that the right to **protection of life and personal liberty under Article 21 of the Constitution** includes the right of citizens to move freely and use public spaces without living under constant fear of attacks or injury from stray dogs.

Over the past several months and years, the situation within our society has deteriorated considerably. We therefore request the Association to address the following concerns:

1. Dog Bite and Scratch Incidents: The management is aware of previous as well as recent incidents involving dog bites and scratches(3 cases). In the interest of transparency and public safety, such incidents should be promptly communicated to all residents rather than remaining undisclosed. To date, no official communication has been issued and no action is taken towards the aggressive dog(s) as per Supreme court guidelines. **Top court 's guidelines states that under no circumstances the aggressive dogs will be released back to their place after sterilization and immunization and shall be kept in a separate pound/shelter by local authorities.**

2. Entry into Staircases and Residential Buildings: One of the most serious concerns is the unrestricted entry of stray dogs into staircases and residential buildings. Staircase gates have been installed in many buildings to prevent stray animals from entering and resting inside. However, some occupants routinely leave these gates open, allowing the dogs to have unrestricted access. Due to unrestricted access, dogs frequently urinate, defecate in common areas resulting in unhygienic conditions.

4. Regulation of Feeding Practices: The courts have recognized that feeding stray dogs should be carried out only at designated locations and in a manner that does not pose any inconvenience to other residents. We request clarification on the following:

- Whether the Association has officially designated feeding areas at ground level.
- Whether fixed feeding timings have been prescribed, and/or monitored.

5. Chasing of stray dogs: The stray dogs frequently bark at and chase moving vehicles, creating an unsafe environment. It is difficult for residents to get in and get out when these dogs stand closed to parked vehicles. During morning and evening walks, the dogs often follow residents, causing fear and discomfort.

7. Veterinary Care and Health Monitoring: We request confirmation as to whether these stray dogs have undergone sterilization, vaccination and periodic veterinary examinations. If so, we request that the relevant records be shared/displayed with residents to provide assurance regarding their health status that they are not spreading any disease due to sickness and compliance with applicable guidelines.

8. Role of Security Personnel: As this is a gated community, security personnel are expected to regulate entry points, monitor common areas and ensure the safety and convenience of residents. During community meetings, cultural programmes, lunch or dinner parties and monthly ladies' gatherings, stray dogs are often seen entering and remaining within the venue which is to be stopped. Further **We request that suitable measures be adopted to prevent stray dogs from entering inside campus from outside and to drive them out if at all any dog enters immediately.**

Despite repeated verbal requests and messages on the society's WhatsApp groups, no visible corrective measures have been implemented. We therefore request the AOA to provide a written response outlining the specific steps proposed, the timeline for implementation and the person or committee responsible for monitoring compliance.

Our objective is to ensure that every resident, including **children, senior citizens and visitors**, can move freely within the society without fear while maintaining harmony with applicable laws and humane practices.

We trust that the Association will treat this matter with the seriousness it deserves and take prompt, practical and transparent action in the interest of all residents.
